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
# "PRESSURE"

## WHAT TEENS ARE REALLY FEELING:

There are many statistics on websites about drug use among teens, and although this information is very useful, it is much more impactful when the information comes from people around you, like your school. Getting information straight from your peers will give you better insight as to why teens are engaging in drug use, what drives them to continue, and how they are impacted by their chosen substances.

According to a survey that was sent out to the students of SLA Beeber, 36.4% of the students who answered the question have tried drugs, while 63.4% have not. The most commonly used drug among teens that have tried them is marijuana at 66.7%. Other drugs that have been used, but are not limited to, cocaine, shrooms, exotic weed, and acid.



of curiosity (64.7%) and the runner ups were peer pressure, rebellion and lack of confidence. Excluding the 60% of teens who do not use drugs, the stats for teens who have tried them are: 40% of these teens use drugs a couple times a year, 6.7% use them at least once a month, 40% use them weekly, and another 40 percent use them daily.

- When asked if the use of drugs has negatively impacted their lives, 73.7% claimed that it does not, with some comments such as "It's very relaxing and helps me sleep." and "It doesn't affect me much." The 26.3% who claimed that it does have a negative impact stated things such as "I had the experience of it and never did them again. There is more to life." Among teens, the opinions and experiences regarding the use of drugs differ from person to person.
- 69.7% of teens have friends that are regular drug users, and luckily, 64.3 percent of those teens do not feel pressured to do drugs when with those friends. More than half of these teens with regular drug using friends believe that it affects the quality of their friend's life and encouraged them to get help.

Overall, every teen has a different opinion on drugs, but the standard view is indifference. Only a few of the teens care that drug use among them is increasing, while most of them state that "They are going to do them anyway so as long as they are safe they should be fine." The issue of drugs is an issue that should not be overlooked, and this should cause even more of a focus on teen mental health.

For my poem, Tonight, in Her Mind, I emulated the style of Danez Smith's Poem Tonight, in Oakland. I wanted my poem to have the same undertone of finding peace and being free from whatever is holding you. Breaking free from an addiction is not easy, but it absolutely worth it.



# ARTIST STATEMENT...
